Academic Regalia

Gowns were worn as early as the twelfth century. Their primary purpose then was to protect the wearer against the elements. When accepted styles of dress began to change in the 16th century, those in the legal and medical professions as well as scholars in the universities retained the traditional dress of gowns and hoods. The origin of the cap is unclear. It has been suggested that it represented the scholar's books, the mortarboard of the master craftsman, or the quadrangular design of the English campus.

Some American universities introduced the use of the academic cap and gown early in their history, but it was not until 1885 that the custom became widespread. Styles and colors had no particular meaning until 1895, when an "Intercollegiate Code" established design and color criteria.

The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves. It is designed to be worn closed. The master's gown has an oblong sleeve open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut, the front part has an arc cut away. The gown may be worn open or closed. The doctor's gown is faced down the front with velvet with three bars of the same across the sleeves. It may be worn open or closed.

The academic hood is the visual representation of the academic degree. The lining of the hood denotes the school conferring the degree, thus, recipients of doctoral degrees from the University of Wisconsin—Milwaukee will wear a hood lined in gold color.

At UWM the color of the velvet binding of the doctoral hood is dark blue. Other edgings on hoods which you may observe in the academic procession are: Doctor of Humane Letters—white, Doctor of Science—yellow, Doctor of Education—light blue.

Recipients of the degree of Master of Arts have white velvet trim on their hoods; those receiving the degree of Master of Science wear hoods trimmed with yellow.

Enclosed please find the following items:

1. A diagram of the arena as it will appear at the commencement exercises.
2. A copy of the ritual booklet.
3. A parking permit for the Civic Center Campus parking lot.
4. A special guest ticket. Should you need additional tickets, please call this office.

Please report to the "Committee Room" on the first floor of the Milwaukee Arena no later than 7:10 p.m. Again, this year we will have the graduates seated so that each dean may present diploma covers to all members of his/her school or college. The enclosed diagram will demonstrate the way each school or college will be seated. Deans will be seated on the stage on the side which corresponds to the position of the Bachelor's candidates for his/her school. The candidates will approach the stage by means of the center aisle to receive diploma covers. Each school will be preceded by a marshal. Thus, when Dean Weston finishes handing out diploma covers to his students a marshal from Letters and Science will lead the candidates from that school to the stage and Dean Halloran will be ready to take his position to hand out the covers. The same process will take place on the other side when Dean Catanese and Dean Schenker will hand out covers. Each dean should be ready to assume his position as he sees the marshal approach.

NEW PROCEDURE:

The Graduate Student Advisory Council has requested that Master's candidates be seated by individual colleges so that each dean may give a congratulatory handshake to his students.

Dean Keulks and the Vice Chancellor will distribute the Master's Diplomas. The Master's candidates from your school will be seated on the same side of the Arena as the Bachelor's candidates from your school. As your candidate approaches, you will position yourself near Dean Keulks or the Vice Chancellor and congratulate the students as they receive diplomas. A marshal will precede the students from each school.

-OVER-

Bachelor and Master candidates will enter the seats using the side aisles; faculty, Ph.D. candidates and platform party will enter by means of the center aisle.

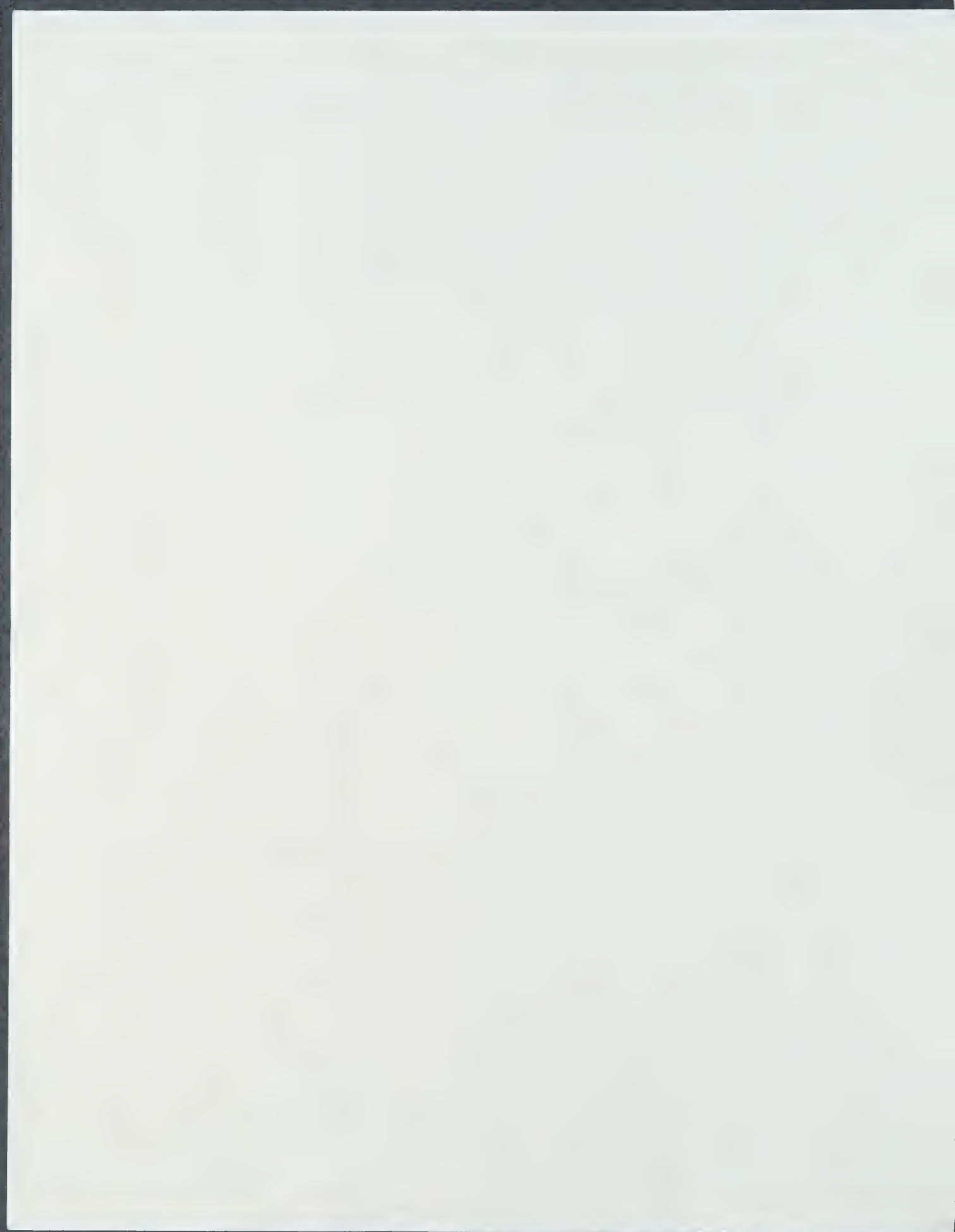

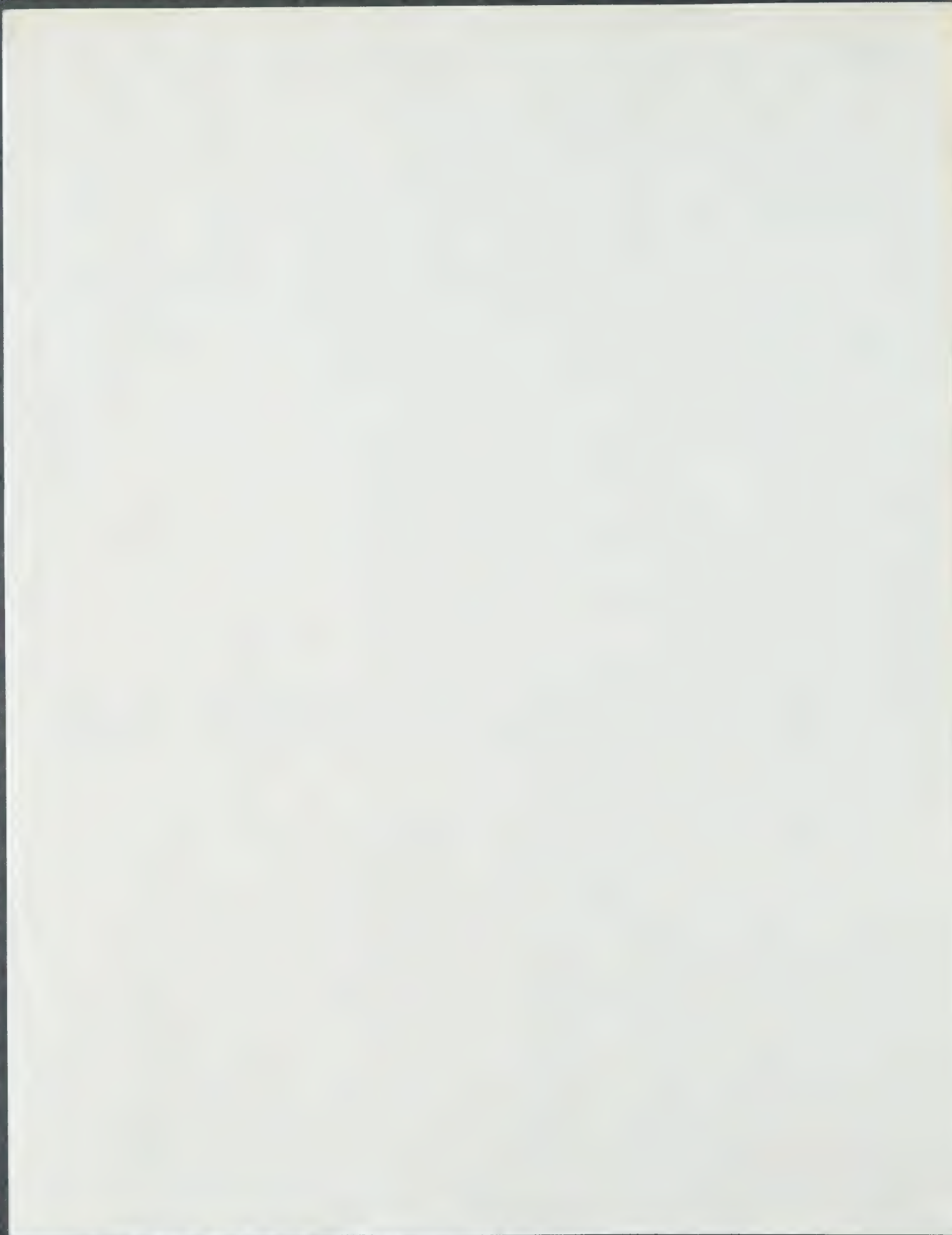
