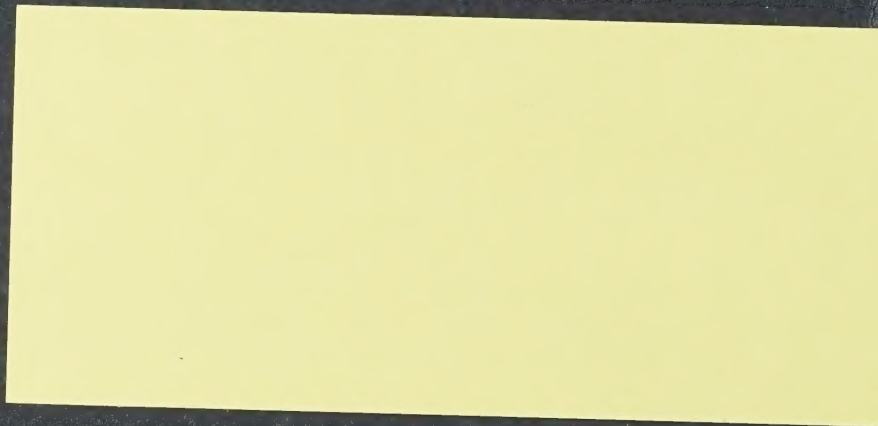

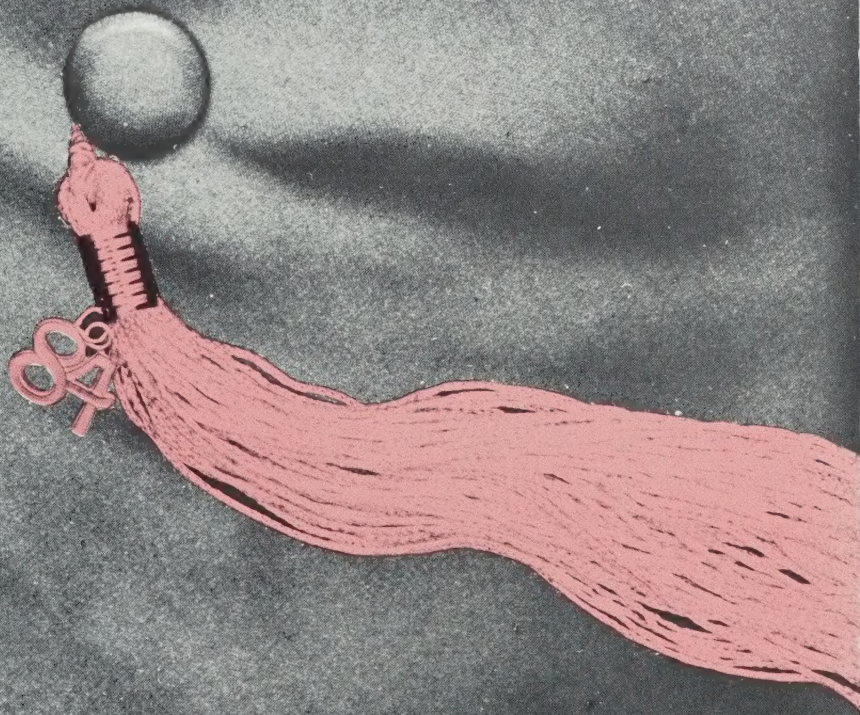
Tickets are not required for the Stadium

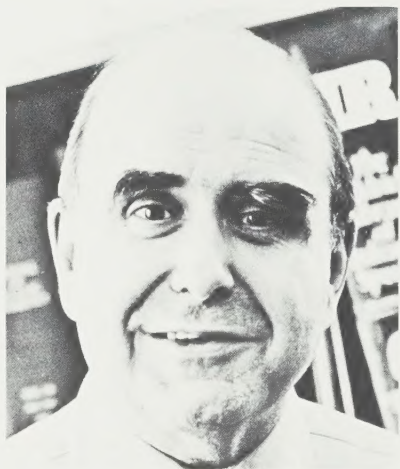

Honorary Degrees



Alfred Robert Bader
Doctor of Science

Former President, now Chairman of the Aldrich Chemical Company of Milwaukee, Alfred Bader has achieved distinction as a research scientist, a corporate executive, an art historian and collector, and a community leader.

Sent as a child from Nazi Germany to the refuge of England, he was educated in Canada and the United States, where he earned the Doctor of Philosophy degree in organic chemistry. Early in his career, he published important research in scientific papers that continue to be cited in the literature of chemistry. In 1954 he became Chief Chemist of the Aldrich Chemical Company, and a year later he became the Company's President. Under his leadership, Aldrich has assumed an international role in the synthesis of organic chemicals and as a source of technical information.

An expert on seventeenth century Dutch and Flemish painting, Alfred Bader has enhanced the Milwaukee Art Center with contributions from his own important collection of paintings. He has been generous too in sharing his keen discernment with seminars in art history on our campus. In a variety of activities, Alfred Robert Bader has cultivated excellence.



Orville George Bentley
Doctor of Science

America's first Assistant Secretary of Agriculture for Science and Education, Orville Bentley received the Doctor of Philosophy degree in biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1950. His subsequent career in teaching and research was crowned by his seventeen year term as Dean of the College of Agriculture at the University of Illinois. His research, which has

yielded extensive publication, illuminated the nutritional requirements of farm animals.

Reared on a farm in South Dakota and trained in the Colleges of Agriculture of that state and of Wisconsin, Orville Bentley understands the problems of farmers. He is able to articulate their concerns. The warm relationship that he therefore enjoys with his agricultural constituency together with his proficiency as a research scientist make him an exceptionally effective leader in the application of science and technology to food production.



Joyce Carol Oates
Doctor of Literature

One of America's most accomplished living writers, Joyce Carol Oates received the Master of Arts degree in English from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1961. At that time she had already begun to write prose fiction and poetry. Indeed, while still

an undergraduate she won the *Mademoiselle* prize for her story, "In the Old World."

Following her time at Wisconsin, she devoted herself intensely to what she has described as "a laughably Balzacian ambition to get the whole world into a book." The result has been prodigious; novels, short stories, poems, plays, critical essays on authors from Shakespeare to Updike. She has explored an astonishing range of styles and genres, always expanding her technical mastery, never reluctant to take artistic risks. And yet she has sustained through her adventurous career a moral vision that is deeply implicated in her work.

Currently a Writer-in-Residence at Princeton University, Joyce Carol Oates is an artist of protean skill.



Russell Wilbur Peterson

Doctor of Laws

President of the National Audubon Society, Russell Peterson has achieved high distinc-

tion in three different fields, so that his present position of leadership in the conservation movement is only the latest in a series of brilliant accomplishments.

Born in Portage, Wisconsin, educated at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where he earned the Bachelor of Science degree with high honors and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in physical chemistry, Russell Peterson spent twenty-seven years as a research chemist with DuPont. He is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and of the American Institute of Chemists. He has received the Parsons Award of the American Chemical Society and the Proctor Prize of Sigma Xi honorary scientific society.

In 1968 he was elected Governor of Delaware, and during his term he was instrumental in the reorganization of that state's governmental structure, the reform of its prison system and its criminal laws, and the protection of its environment.

As President of the National Audubon Society, Russell Peterson's is the leading voice of the conservation movement in our country.



Alan Schneider

Doctor of Humane Letters

America's foremost director of avant-garde theater, Alan Schneider has staged the premier performances of some of the most important plays of this century. The playwrights whose work has been entrusted to Alan Schneider include Samuel Beckett, Edward Albee, Tennessee Williams, Harold Pinter, Elie Wiesel, Arthur Miller, Berthold Brecht—a virtual inventory of the greatest playwrights of our time.

Alan Schneider earned the Bachelor's degree *summa cum laude* at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. As an undergraduate he was active in drama, forensics and debate, and as literary and drama critic for the *Daily Cardinal*. Since 1953, when he directed his first Broadway production, he has shaped over a hundred dramatic productions in New York City and in regional and university theaters throughout this country and abroad.

He has held professorships at Catholic University, Boston University, the Julliard School, and the University of California at San Diego. His dedication to the highest ideals of humanistic education has become legendary.



Evelyn Steenbock
Doctor of Humane Letters

For over sixty years, Evelyn Steenbock has been associated with the University Wisconsin-Madison, first as an undergraduate in Home Economics and Nutrition; then as Master's student in biochemistry; as a research scientist with the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation; as the wife and collaborator of the late Professor Harry Steenbock; and more recently as the creator and developer of the Steenbock Professorships in the natural sciences, the Steenbock Lectureships, the Career Advancement

Award in biochemistry, and the Steenbock Young Artist Competition. She has provided significant support to this University's School of Music and its Elvehjem Museum of Art, to the Madison Art Center and the Madison Symphony Orchestra.

Evelyn Steenbock's imaginative and timely benefactions have been enhanced by her personal commitment of service to the University and to Madison. She works as a volunteer in a variety of good causes, always quietly and self-effacingly, always with devotion and intelligence.

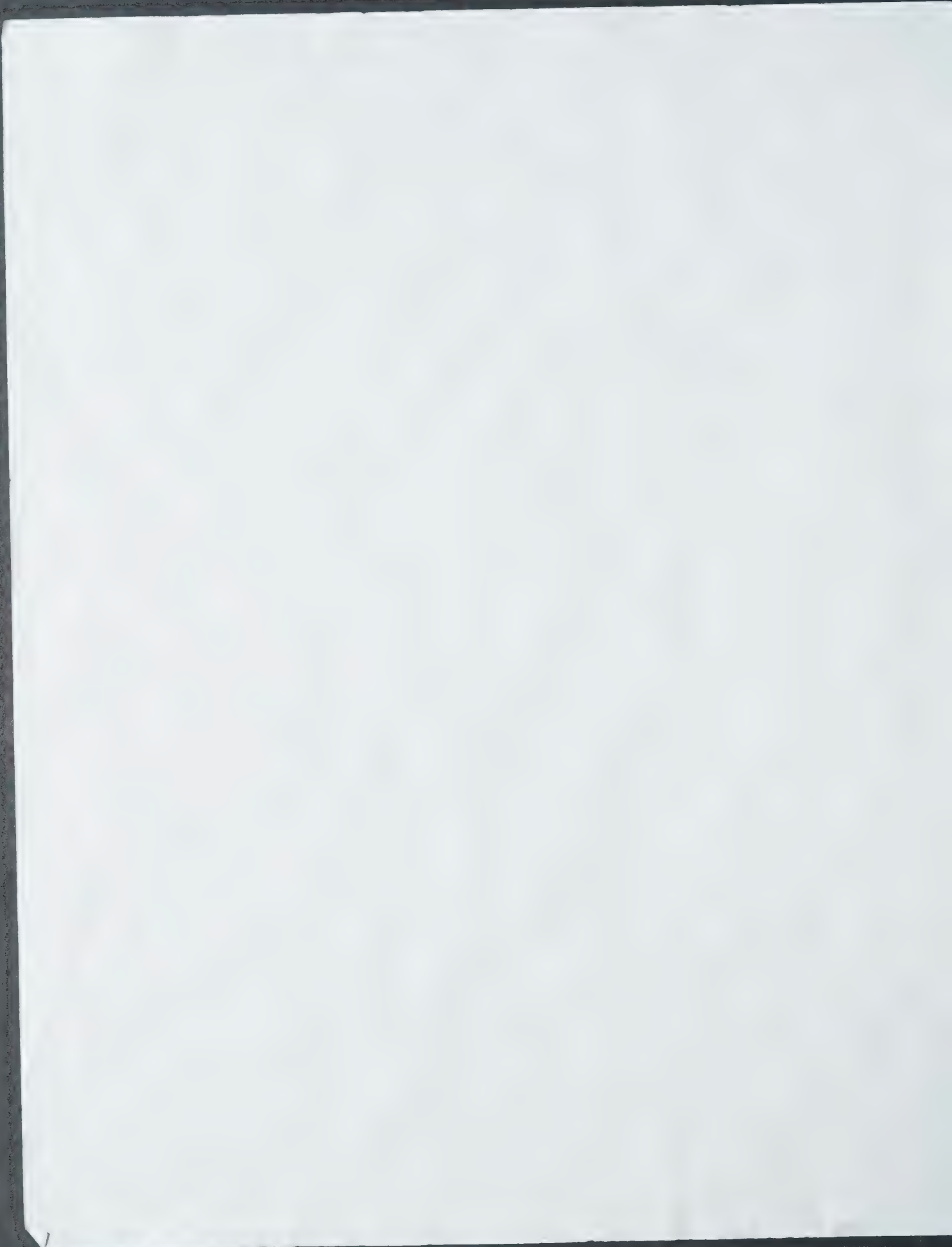


Paul Vanderbilt
Doctor of Humane Letters

Curator Emeritus of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin, Paul Vanderbilt is nationally recognized as a pioneer in the use of visual imagery as a cultural and historical resource.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin in 1954, Paul Vanderbilt served as Chief of the Prints and Photographic division of the Library of Congress. During his tenure in the office, he began setting the fundamental standards of and methods for the field of photographic resource documentation.

At the State Historical Society of Wisconsin, where he served until his retirement in 1972, Paul Vanderbilt catalogued and classified the collection of over a million images. His work established that institution as one of the foremost iconographic archives in the United States. There is today scarcely a single book or journal in American studies or history that does not use the documentary picture; thirty years ago, there was scarcely a single book or journal that did. Paul Vanderbilt is one of the principal architects of that change. His achievements have enriched the vision that Americans have of their past.

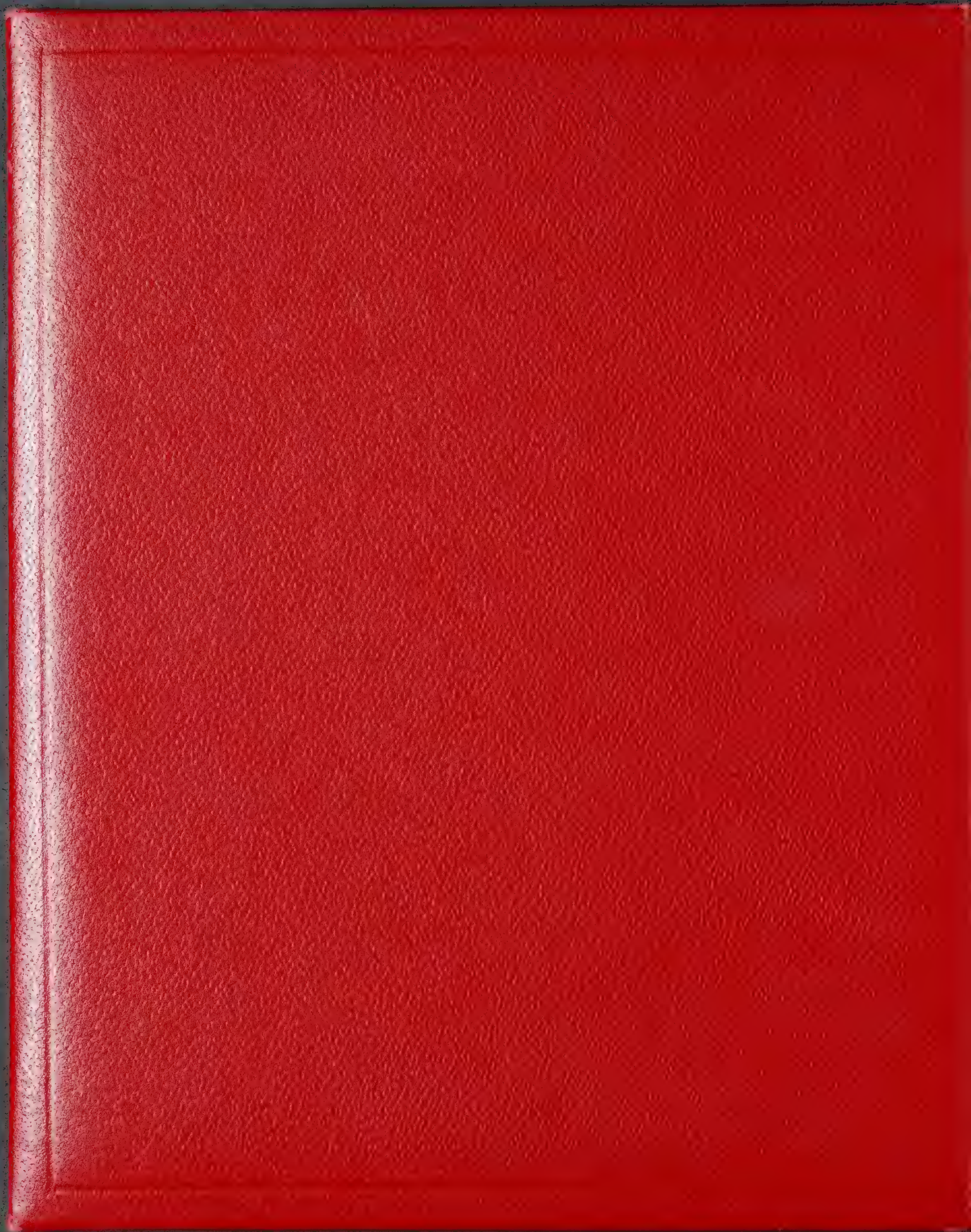

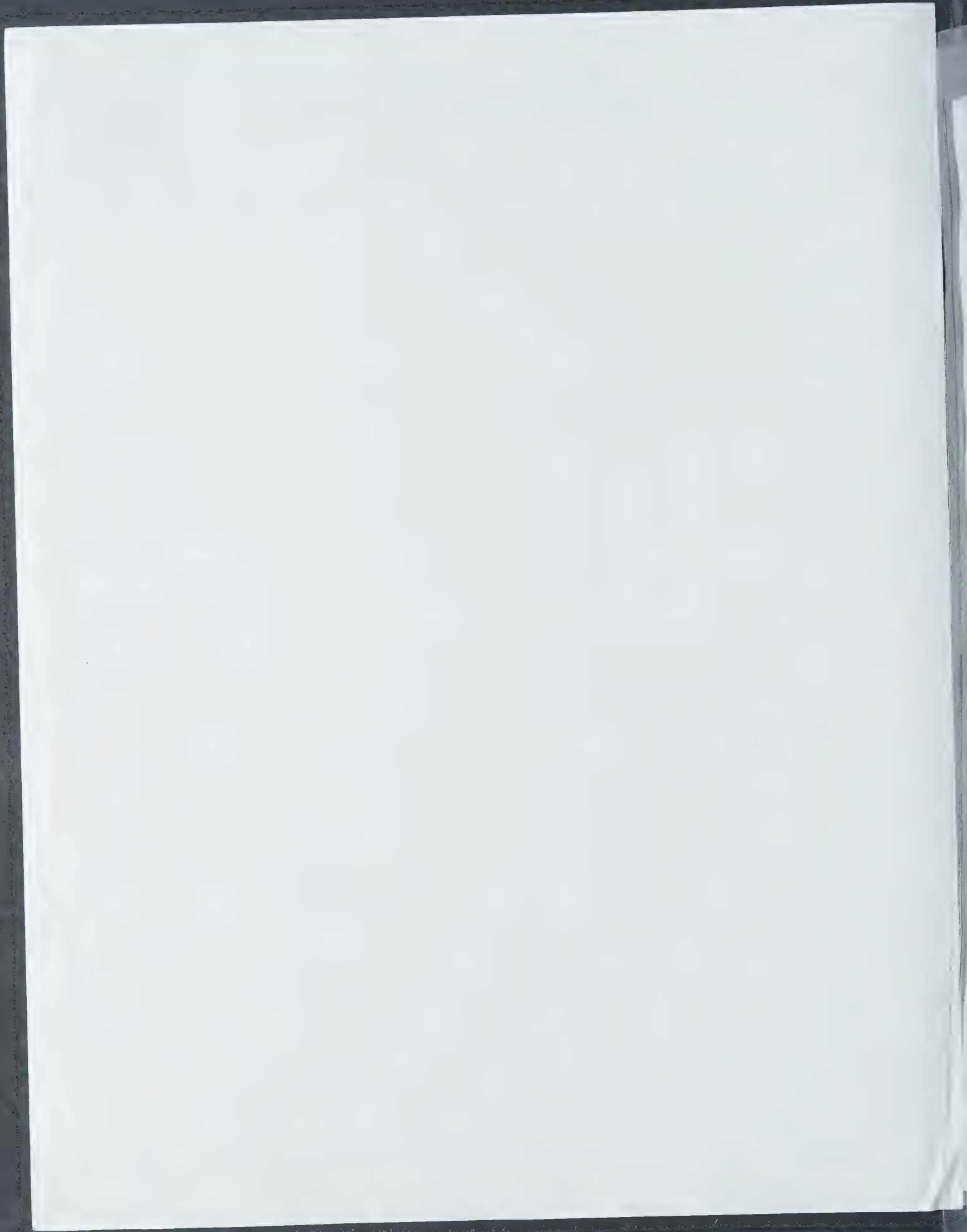

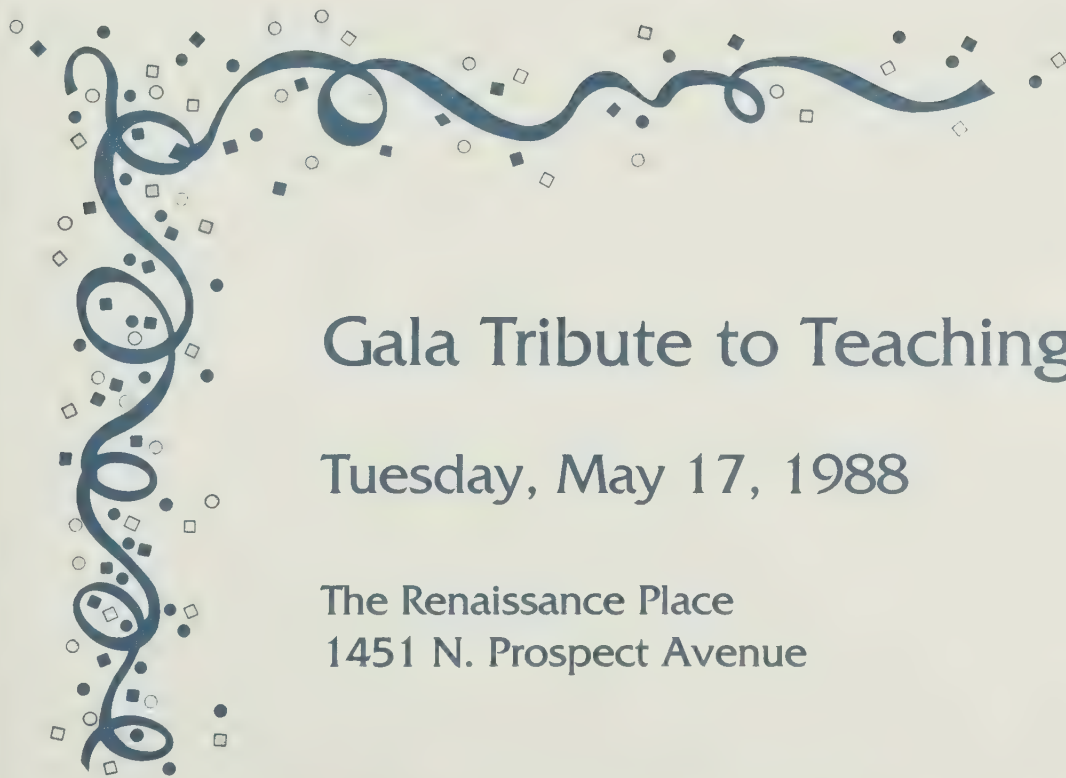

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

Candidates should wear the academic cap, gown, and hood appropriate to the degree. These may be rented or purchased at the University Book Store, 711 State Street. Orders are taken for rental gowns March 26 through May 2. Orders for caps, gowns and hoods should be made as early as possible. Candidates eligible for convocation honors will receive a letter from their dean concerning the wearing of the honors stole at the ceremony.

Caps and Tassels

Candidates for the bachelor's degree wear the black mortar board cap with tassels of their course color.

Candidates for all higher degrees wear the regulation cap with black tassel.

Gowns

The bachelor's gown has a closed front and long pointed, open sleeves. The master's gown has a closed front with long, closed sleeves. The doctor's gown has an open front and large bell-shaped sleeves with three velvet bars (black, but sometimes in course colors). Marshals wear cardinal gowns with white bars.

Hoods

The bachelor's hood is rather short, with a narrow velvet edging of the appropriate color (see list) and a lining in the color or colors of the institution—cardinal at Wisconsin. The bachelor's hood is worn only by those who previously received the baccalaureate degree.

The master's hood is considerably longer, has a wider velvet edging, and exposes more of the lining. Candidates for higher degrees wear the hood throughout the commencement ceremony. The edging is yellow for science and white for arts.

The doctor's hood has a wider velvet edging, wide panels at either side, greater length, and fully exposed lining. The colors of edging are blue for Philosophy, green for Medicine, and purple for Law.

Honors

Candidates who have been awarded honors in general scholarship are distinguished by cardinal stoles, which consist of panels draped over the shoulders. White stoles with cardinal bars distinguish honors degree candidates. Stoles are worn only with the cap and gown.

INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES AND OTHER PARTICIPANTS

SATURDAY, MAY 19

7 p.m., Honors Convocation

The honors convocation will be held at 7 p.m. in the University Field House. Degree candidates who rank in the upper 20 percent of the college or school or participate in the honors program are eligible and will be notified of their selection for honors by their dean. Tickets for admission are not required.

Honors students will assemble for the procession at 6:45 p.m. outside the east side of the Field House. If it rains, the procession will form inside the Field House. Marshals will arrange the procession.

Candidates who have been awarded convocation honors will wear the cardinal honors stole with cap and gown during the convocation and at commencement. Candidates for the honors degree wear white stoles with cardinal bars. Stoles may be obtained at the University Book Store. A deposit is required for the use of the stoles and is refunded upon their return after commencement. Honors students who are not attending the commencement ceremony may join the procession without cap and gown. No stoles are worn.

8 p.m., Chancellor's Reception

Chancellor and Mrs. Shain will host an informal reception for candidates, their families, and friends immediately following the Honors Convocation. The reception will be held in the north concourse area of the Field House.

SUNDAY, MAY 20

9:30 a.m., Commencement Ceremony

The commencement ceremony in Camp Randall Stadium is open to the public. Tickets are not needed for admission to the Stadium. However, in case weather conditions make it necessary, the ceremony will be transferred indoors to the Field House. Tickets are required for admission to the Field House. Each candidate receives two tickets with the rental of the cap and gown at the Book Store. The ceremony lasts about two and a half hours. Please invite your relatives and friends. Invitations may be purchased at the University Book Store.

Candidates for a degree in May 1984 or those who have completed requirements for degrees since last May are welcome to take part in the commencement ceremony.

Attendance is voluntary. Bachelor's candidates who will complete their degree requirements in the 1984 summer session also may participate. Summer session candidates should inform the Committee on Public Functions, 134 Bascom Hall, if they plan to attend.

Candidates should wear the academic costume appropriate to their degree (see back page) which may be rented or purchased at the University Book Store, 711 State Street.

Assembling and Marching of Candidates

Candidates will assemble in the parking lot 17 area north of the stadium by 8:45 a.m. for the student procession.

Candidates will march by degree groups. Signs or shields will mark the location of the groups, and marshals wearing cardinal gowns will assist with assembling. Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Medicine candidates will be accompanied by faculty escorts.

At precisely 9:30 a.m., the candidates, led by marshals, will march into the stadium and file into assigned seats in the west stands. Each group of candidates will be preceded by a marshal carrying a shield indicating the appropriate college or school. The official party will follow the last file of candidates to its place on the platform.

Alcoholic Beverages

Many who have attended recent commencements have expressed concern about the number of participants who bring alcohol to the ceremony. We ask your support and help for our efforts to conduct a commencement ceremony which reflects our pride in and respect for the accomplishments of the degree candidates, the support given by their families and friends, and the opportunities provided by the University. We want commencement to be a joyous occasion, but one whose dignity appropriately marks the respect we have for those who are to be honored. Please do not bring to the ceremony alcoholic beverages or other items which detract from the significance of this occasion.

Program

Chancellor Shain will preside. The program will include a welcome by the chancellor, music by the University Band, brief comments from state and University system officials, remarks by a student on behalf of the Class of 1984, and a welcome from the Alumni Association.

Conferring of Degrees

The honorary degrees will be conferred by the chancellor, followed by the conferring of the academic degrees.

The dean of the Graduate School will ask the Doctor of Philosophy candidates to rise. The dean will present them to the chancellor, who will confer the degrees, and the candidates will march across the platform with escorts to receive their diplomas and then return to their seats. The Doctor of Medicine and Doctor of Law candidates will be presented by their deans in a similar manner.

Master's candidates will be presented by the dean of the Graduate School to the chancellor, who will confer the degree. Candidates will march across the platform.

In conferring the bachelor's degrees, degree groups will be presented by the deans in the order listed in the program which will be available at the Stadium. The respective deans will ask each group to rise separately to be acknowledged. After all graduates have been acknowledged, all will be asked to rise again by the chancellor, who will confer the degrees.

After the chancellor pronounces the final words "... and, in testimony thereof, will receive the diploma," the candidates who are standing will immediately grasp the tassels of their caps with the left hand and transfer them to the left side of their caps. (All candidates for first degrees wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the degree has been conferred. Candidates for higher degrees do not shift their tassels; they wear them on the left side from the outset.) Bachelor's degree candidates will not march across the platform.

Other Information

Caps, gowns, and hoods may be rented or purchased at the University Book Store, 711 State Street. Orders for rentals will be taken from March 26 through May 2.

Rented caps, gowns, hoods and stoles should be returned to the University Bookstore Monday, or in the Field House immediately following the ceremony.

Diploma covers will be given to each student attending the ceremony. If you do not plan to attend, you may call at the information office in the lobby of the Peterson Office Building to obtain your diploma cover.

Diplomas will be mailed after graduation requirements are checked. Diplomas will be sent by surface mail to all addresses out of the country unless the candidate arranges in Room 123 Peterson Building to pay in advance for the diploma to be sent via airmail or registered mail.


Dear Dr. Bader:

Some time ago you received a letter from Chancellor Shain in which he described some of the events related to the conferral of your honorary degree. On behalf of the Committee on Public Functions, I am pleased to provide some more information about the arrangements for that honor which I hope will be useful. As you already know, you and the other honorary degree recipients are to be cited at the Honors Convocation, which will be held at 7:00 p.m., Saturday, May 19. We ask that you and Professor Phillip Certain, your faculty escort, join the platform group at 6:45 p.m. in the Reinke Room at the north end of the University Field House. At the Convocation, Chancellor Shain will introduce you, and your citation will be read by Professor Edwin Black, Chairman of the Committee on Honorary Degrees. We ask that you make a brief response at the time, from three to five minutes in length.

Your honorary degree will be conferred at the Commencement Sunday, May 20. The ceremony is scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m. and we ask that you join the platform party at 9:00 a.m. in the National W-Club Room beneath the east stands of the Stadium. A permit is enclosed for the parking area east of the Field House and adjacent to Gate 21, where you should enter. If it rains, the ceremony will be held in the Field House, and the procession will form at the Reinke Room in that building.

In order for us to provide you with the appropriate academic attire, we need to know your height and your hat or cap size. The cap, gown, and a hood appropriate to your highest earned degree and conferring institution will be ready for you on Saturday evening before the Honors Convocation. The honorary degree hood, a gift of the University, will be presented to you on Sunday.
