

### **Herbal Remedies Course**

Only a week ago in the update for Dr Bader we reported that we were trying to recruit women for the Maccabi Herbal course for the Northern Bedouin community. In only a short week it has become clear through research done on the field that this community does not have the wherewithal to undergo this relatively technical course because of their lack in scientific knowledge. JDC along with MATI have come up with a similar course to be undertaken in a different way.

The whole idea of the Herbal remedies course arose out of the fact that the Bedouin community has a traditional and cultural knowledge of herbal remedies. It is entrenched in their traditional society and has been passed down from generation to generation. JDC believed that we would be able to find candidates to convert this into a practical skill and turn these women into providers of alternative healthcare. As the recruitment has once again proven unsuccessful an alternative course in herbal remedies has been put together. The course comprises of teaching these women how to grow the plants produce and package the herbal remedies themselves in order to sell them successfully. Herbal remedies are very popular within their community and also within Israeli society as a whole as people look for alternative new age ways of healing. There are different trade fairs where these women will be able to sell their wares as well as in their own markets and cottage industries. The course will begin in July and run till October and will be taught by various experts in the field; chemists farmers, marketing experts etc. The cost will be in the region of \$15,000.

## **Partners**

JDC has various partners for all the courses that it runs for women in minority groups in Israel. Each of the partners cover a certain element of the course. It is very difficult to give exact quantities for each course but we can describe it on a percentage basis.
