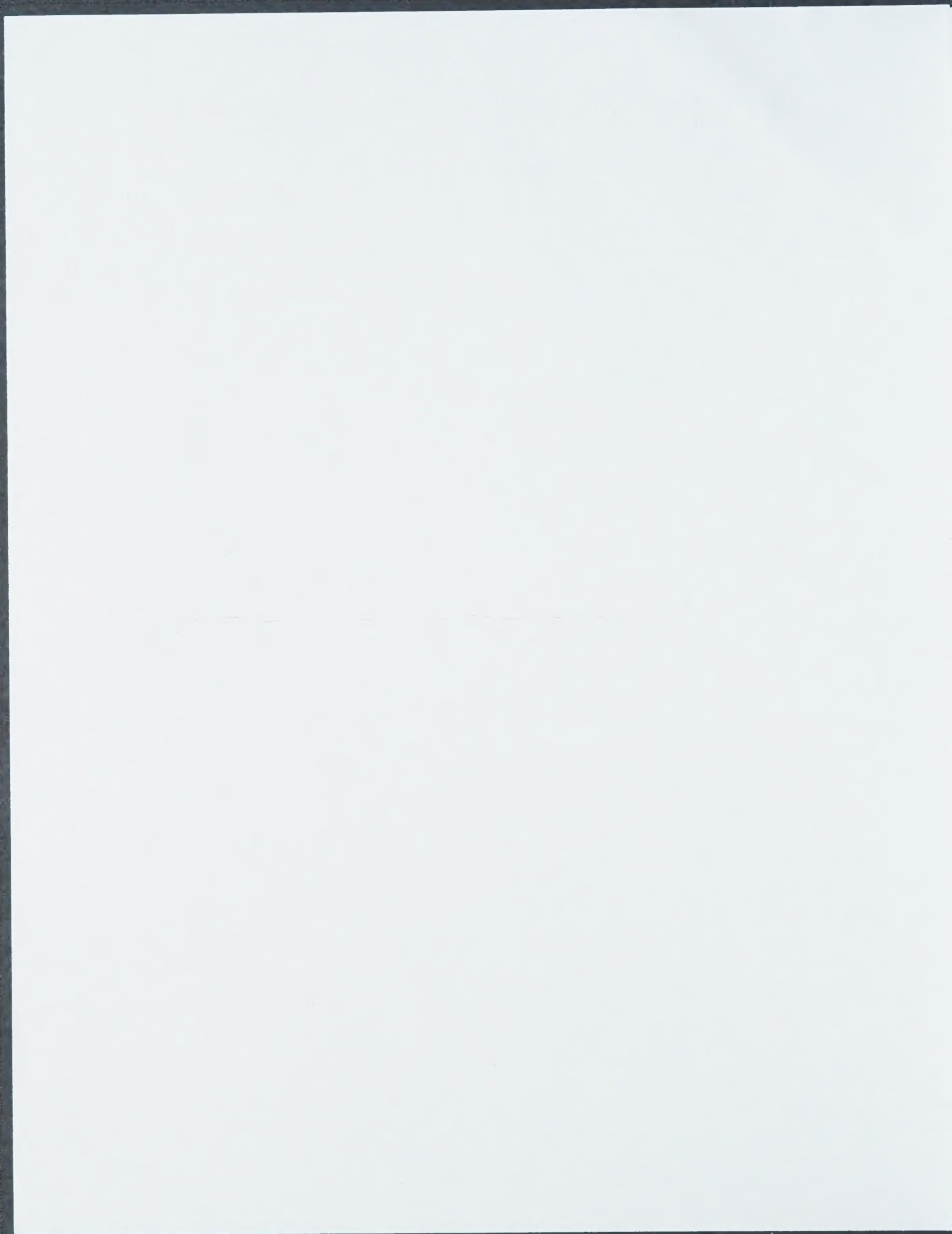

I am pleased to provide you with a report about the 2014-15 recipients of **The Isabel Bader Scholarships, The Bader International Bursaries, The Isabel Bader Bursaries,** and the first recipient of the newly-established **Alfred and Isabel Bader Scholarship** at Victoria College in the University of Toronto.

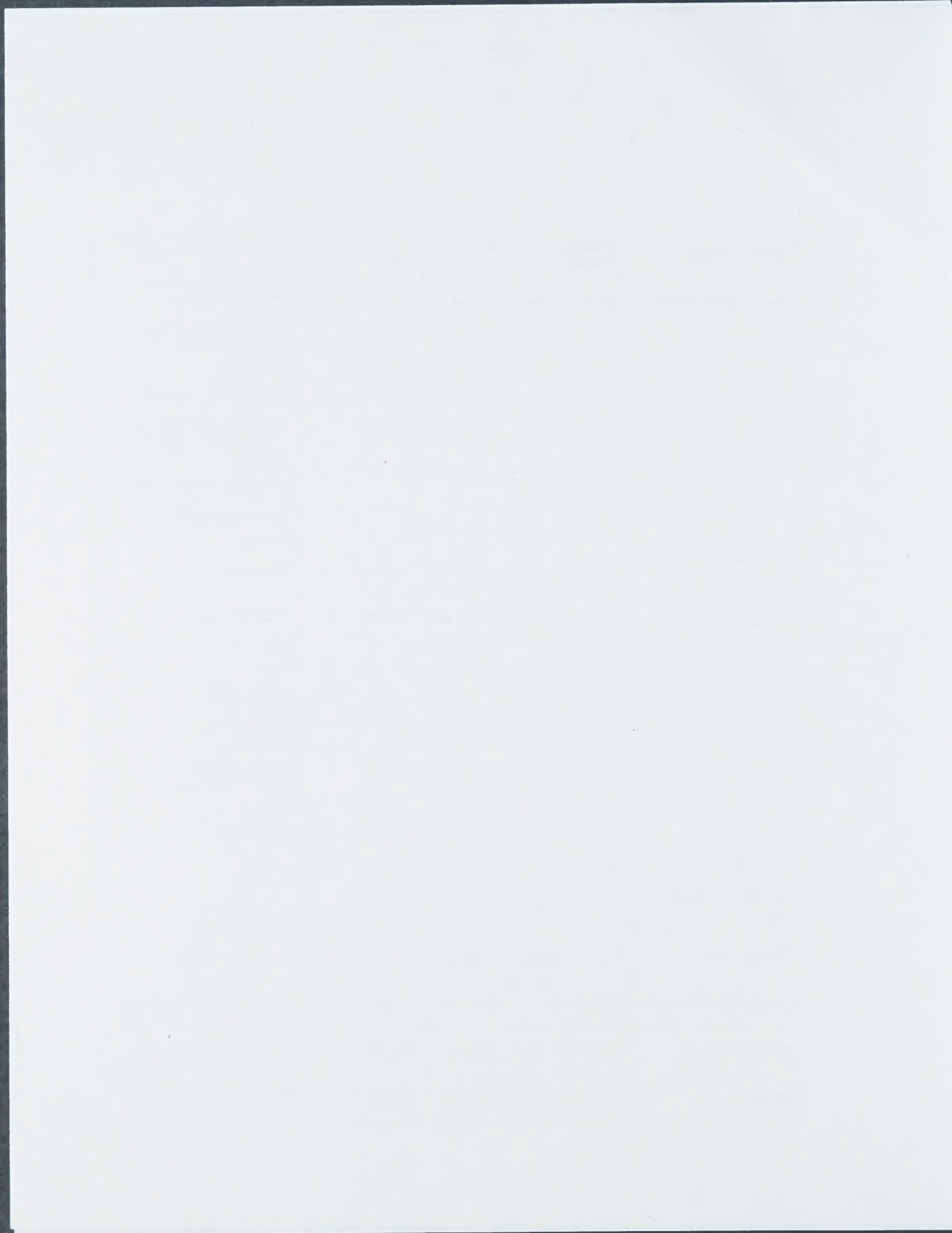
This year, 39 students received **Isabel Bader Scholarships**: 2 admission scholarships (valued at \$3,500 in the first year and \$4,500 in second, third and fourth year), 7 renewed admission scholarships, and 29 in-course scholarships (valued at \$1,000 each). In addition, one student was awarded the new **Alfred and Isabel Bader Scholarship** (valued at \$1,000). In total, **\$67,000** was awarded for scholarships. 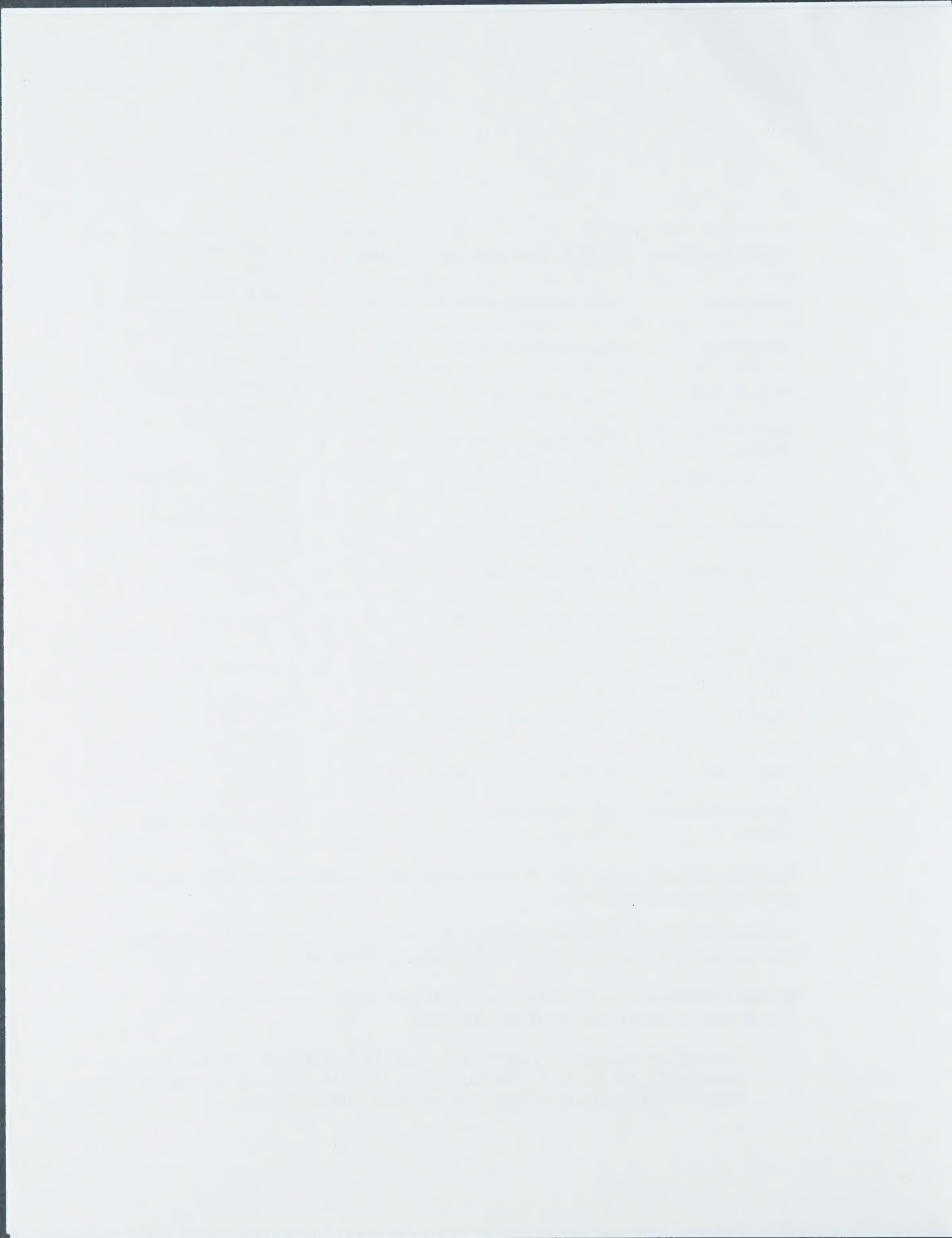

Regarding the **Bader International Bursary**, we are currently accepting applications from potential candidates who have applied for the summer program at Herstmonceux Castle.

**Six Bader Bursaries** were disbursed to financially deserving students totaling **\$10,200**. Two examples of these recipients are described below:

- A second year student, studying Art History and Aboriginal Studies, received a bursary of \$2,200 towards her outstanding fees. She does not receive any parental support and must rely on government assistance to fund her education.



I am pleased to provide the enclosed report detailing both the Statement of Endowment Capital and Statement of Distributed Income.

The Statement of Endowment Capital shows the value of the original gift, the income that has been transferred to support the purpose of the gift, and the amount of earnings or losses that have been retained since 1999, the year we started unitizing our Endowment Fund.

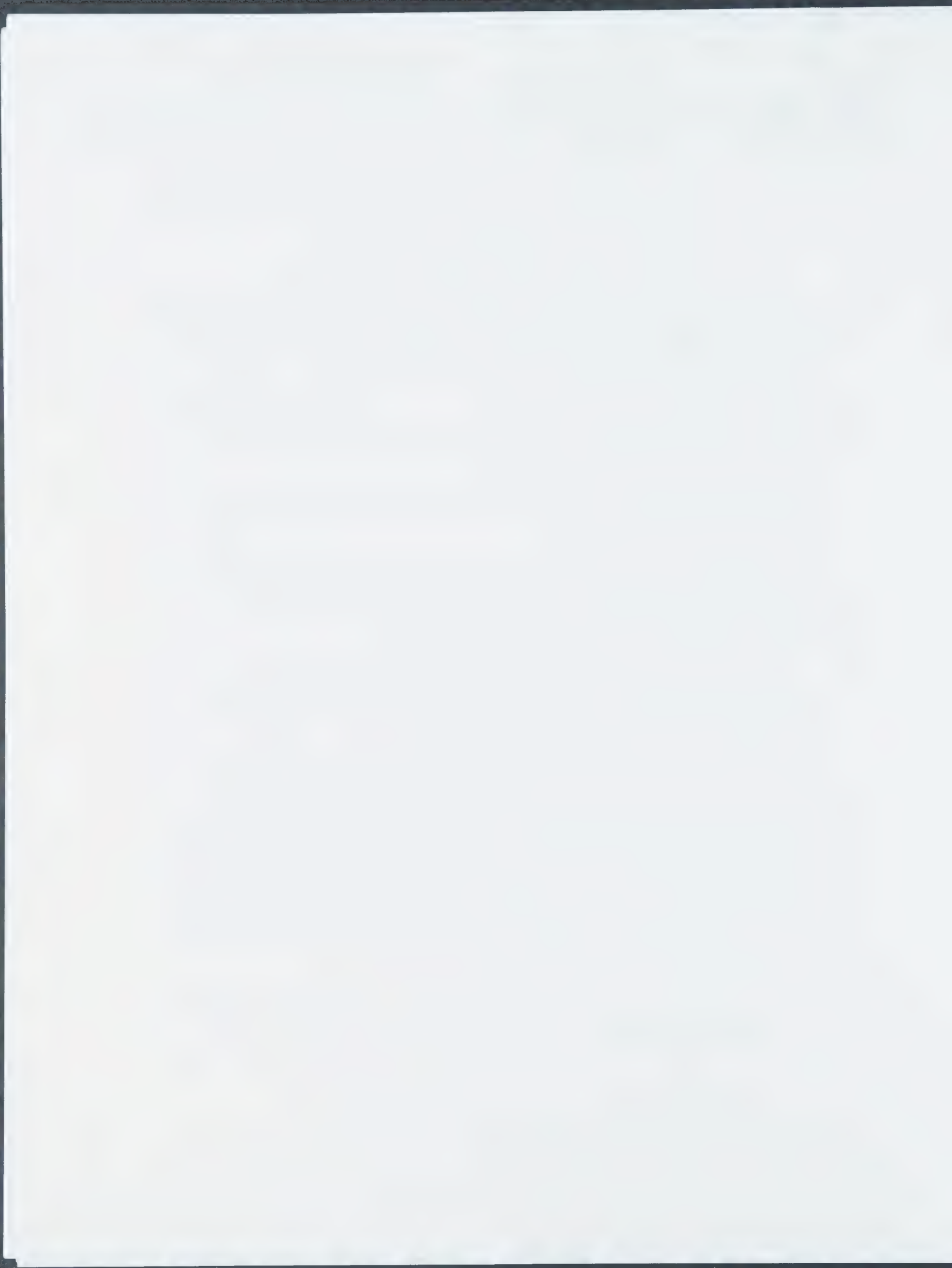
Unitizing the Endowment Fund allows us to track each named account separately. At the end of April 2014, the unit value was \$94.95; at the end of April 30, 2013, the unit value was \$77.70, which is an increase of \$17.25 per unit net of all distributions and expenses.

Victoria University is fortunate to have an Investment Committee staffed primarily by investment professionals who assist the administration in all aspects of endowment management. Our external consultant, Aon Hewitt, continues to advise on the University's investments and monitors its external managers' performance. For the period ending December 31, 2013, Victoria's Fund returns were quite strong. Victoria's one-year return (before fees) was 25.2%. The Fund exceeded its own one-year benchmark for the same period by 1.6%.

The Committee strives to achieve the required Fund performance, while keeping risk within tolerable limits.

A first-year student from the University of Toronto participated in the Herstmonceux Castle, U ofT Centre for International Experience (CIE) Exchange during the 2013 summer session. Her studies at the Bader International Study Centre helped to augment the major program in English that she is currently enrolled in. She is also pursuing the Women & Gender Studies major program.

**Seven Bader Bursaries** were disbursed to financially deserving students totaling **\$9,800**. Two examples of these students are described below:

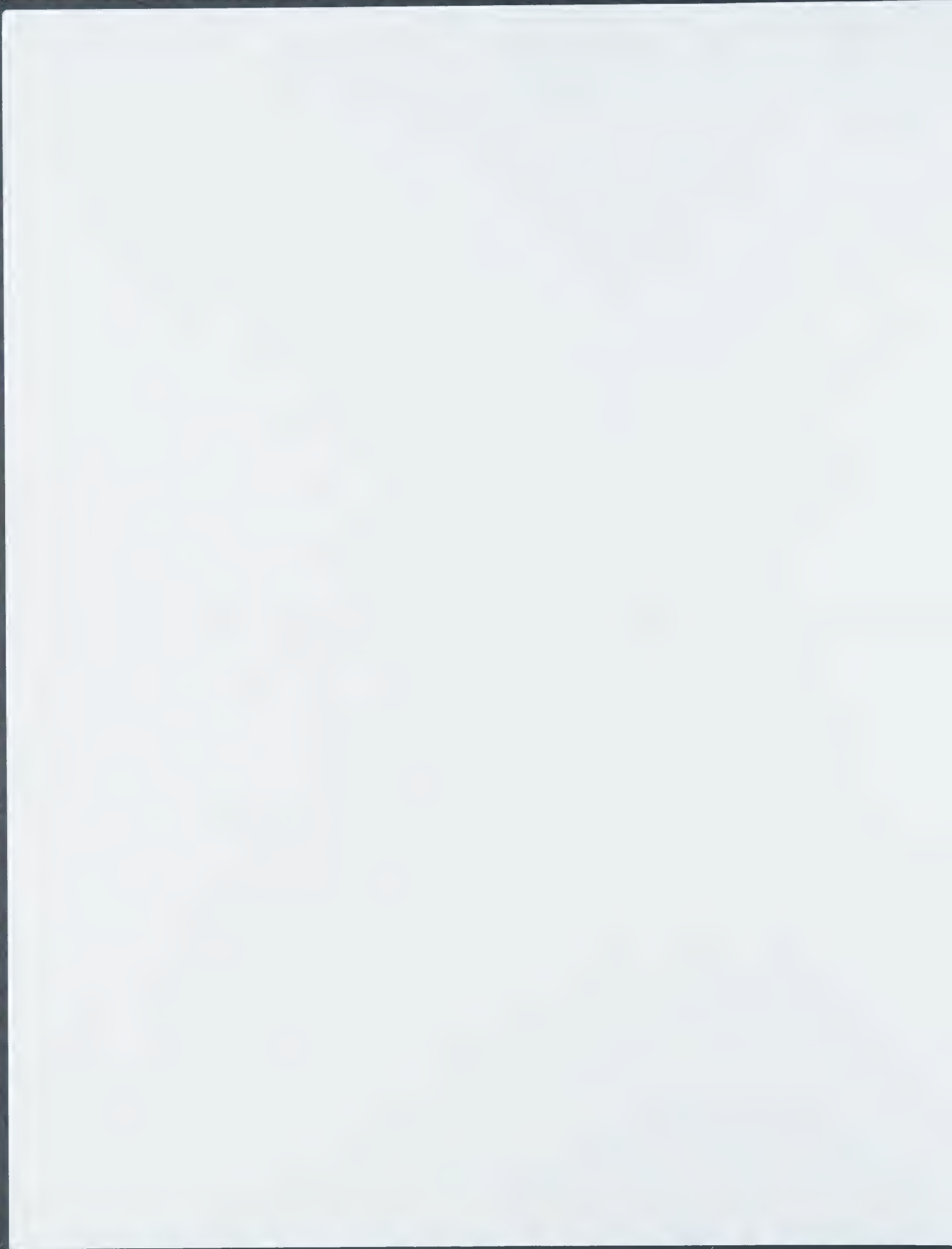
- A female student in third year studies in Cognitive Science, Linguistics, and Psychology received a bursary of \$2,000 to help cover a shortfall in her funds. She comes from a very low, single income family and relies on government assistance to pay for her studies.
- Another student in fourth year received a bursary of \$1,300. She comes from a single-parent home that is supporting three dependents, and she has been struggling to meet all of her academic and living costs during the school year. This student is working towards completing programs in Psychology, Health & Disease, and Biology.

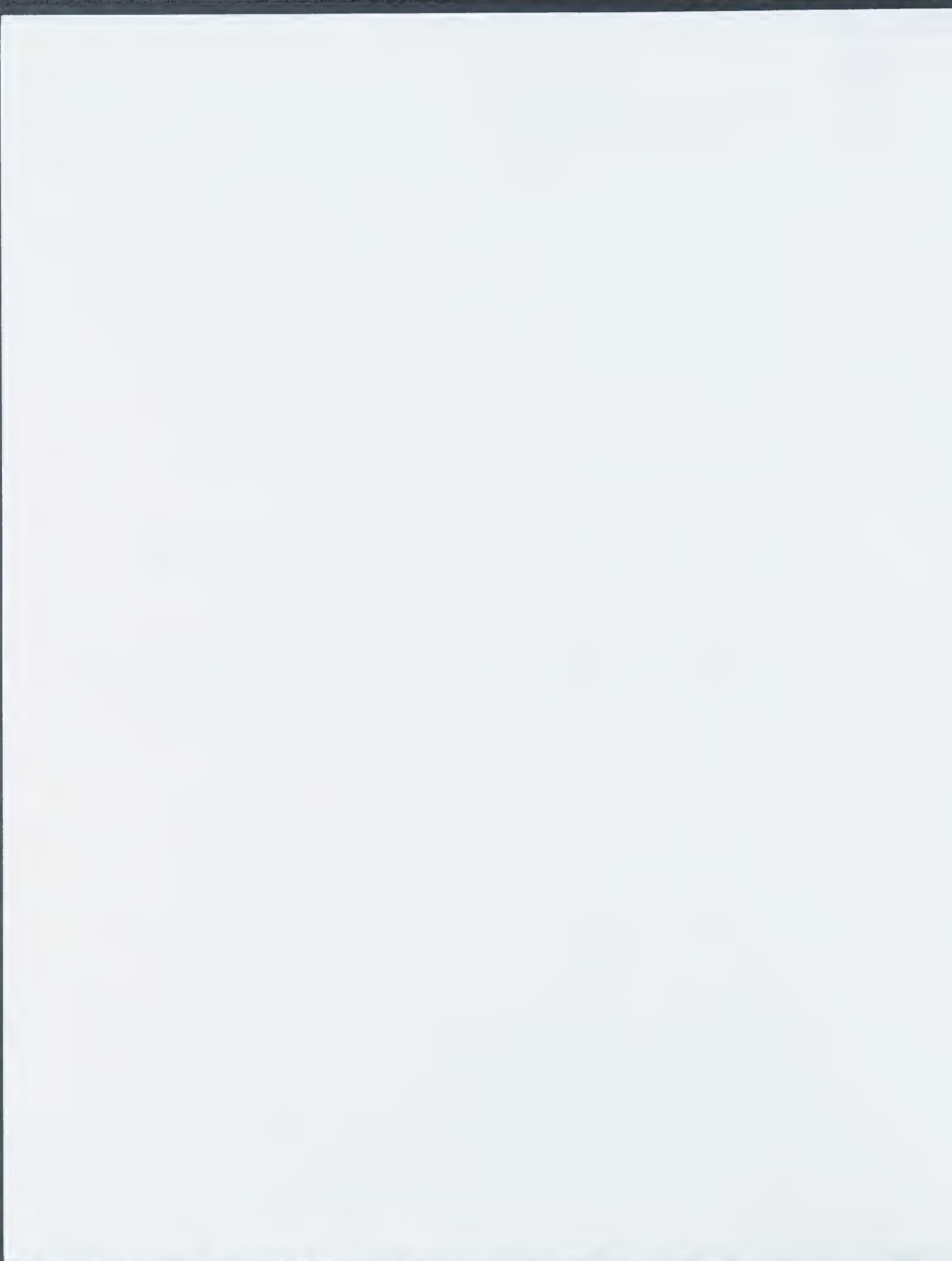

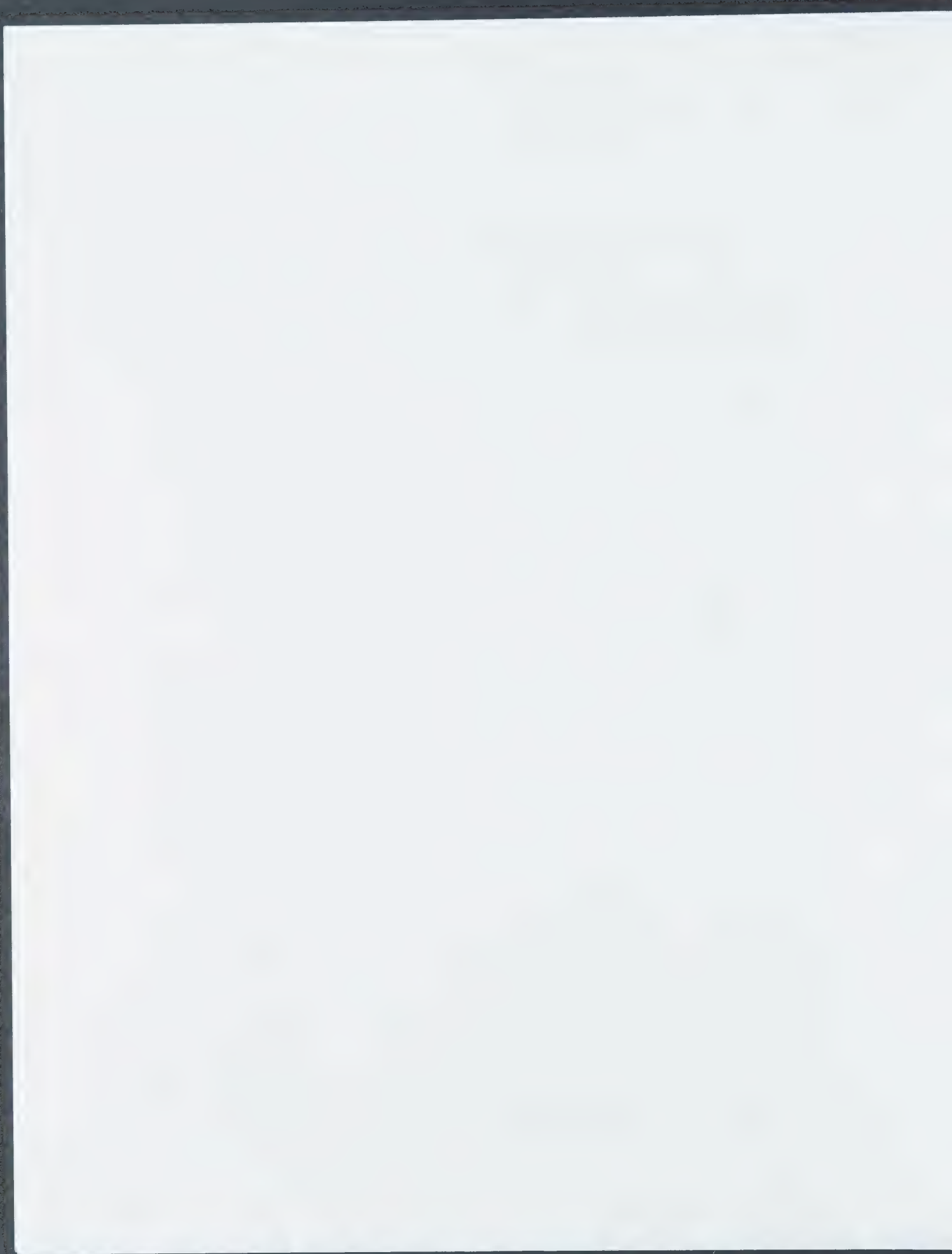

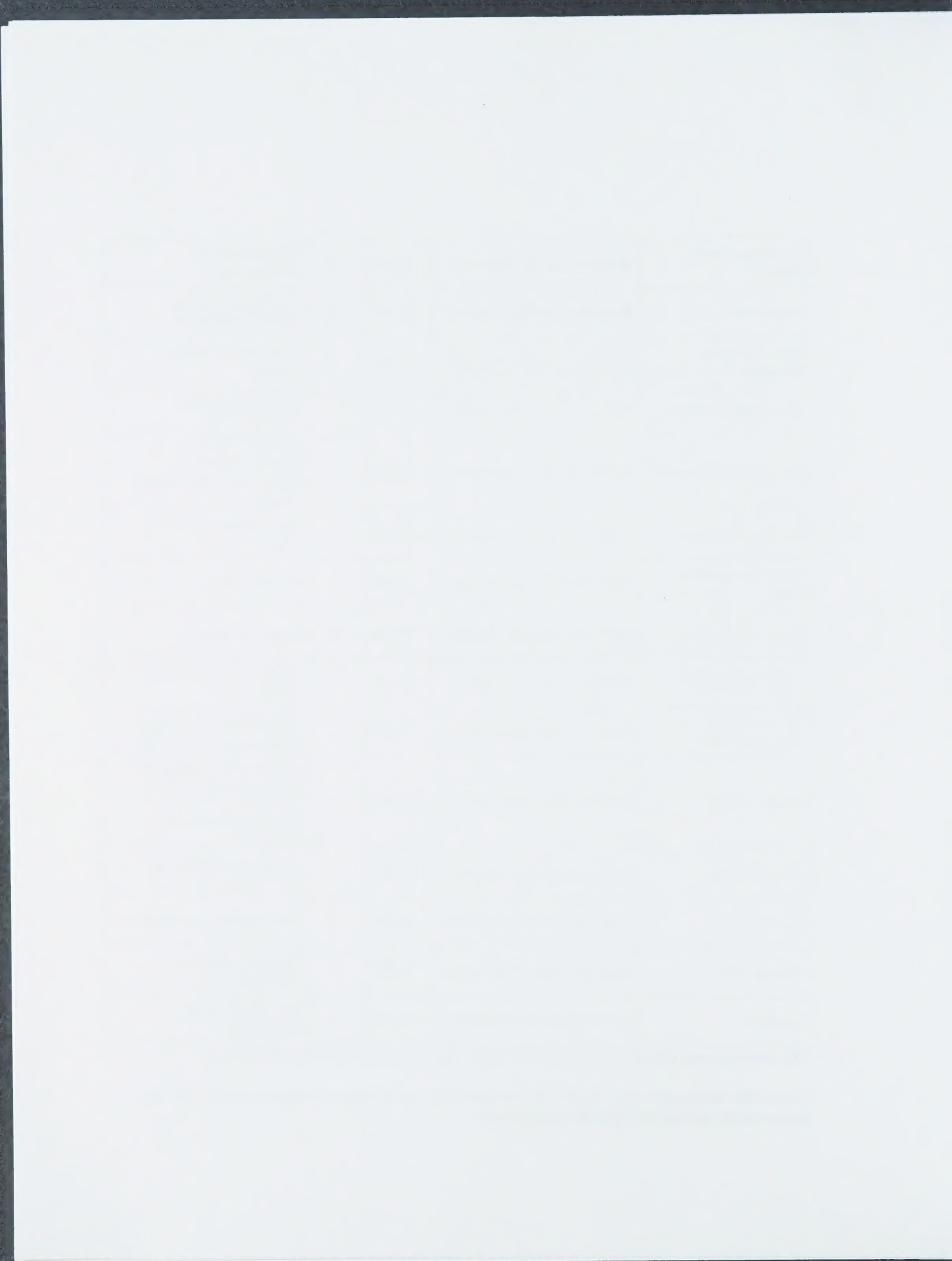
