

We both much look forward to our visit with you toward the end of August.



I wanted to follow up on our conversation of the weekend past and thank you for beginning what I hope will be an ongoing dialogue.

I have done a bit of research since we talked on the weekend and to be honest, the best that I can gather vis-à-vis The Fine Arts Quartet is that Boris Castel may have extended an invitation and then withdrawn it. This is not uncommon and of course since May, 2014 would still have fallen into the final months of Dr Castel's contract, it would have been wholly his prerogative to do so. And as you know, the programming of the current year continued to evolve as more information became available about the readiness of our site. It really is unfortunate that the Tett project is so far behind schedule because it will be a long time between my arrival in the building (February) and the first audiences (September). So I look forward to your visit in April because I will be very lonely by then!

I am going to explore some possibilities of working with the music department at some form of teaching visit for the Fine Arts Quartet, most likely for 2015/2106 since planning for 2014/2015 is pretty well complete. I note that Juan-Miguel Fernandez is from Montreal! So his family will be able to come to hear him play! I will keep you posted on how this unfolds.

I want to encourage you to call me at any time if you are not satisfied that you are being kept in the loop. As you can imagine, things are moving at a mile-a-minute here so there is a great deal that is changing almost daily, but I'll always have time to bring you up-to-date.


I hope that this note finds both you and Dr Bader well.

Www.Queensu.ca/Provost I am cleaning off my desk while I take what will probably be my only vacation until the end of the 2015 school year! But I did want to send you a note to wish you the very best of the season.

I wanted you to know that I did speak with Dr Castel about the Fine Arts Quartet and he did suggest that when it became apparent that our site was not going to be completed by May that he felt that perhaps it would be best to invite the group another time. As you know I had not heard about this development until our phone call but I am certainly keeping the quartet in mind for 2015/2016.

I thought also that you might be interested in learning about what I am working on in terms of programming. We will have a total of 5 series in our first season at the Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts. The first series is called "The Soloists" and will be 4 solo recitals spread over the course of the school year. The second series is called "The Ensembles" and will have 4 concerts with trios, quartets and chamber groups. The third series is called "The Innovators" which will be 4 concerts featuring artists who started as classical musicians but have used their classical training to explore different styles of music such as jazz or a contemporary/classic sound (Yo Yo Ma is a great example of somebody who has been an innovator over the years!). The fourth series will be the existing Faculty Series. The fifth series will be completely new to Queen's — a series programmed by 4 students for a student audience. It will be a mentorship program, and at different times each of the students will work with me, a publicist, a marketing officer and our technical director. So by the end they should have had a well-rounded experience. As well, I am developing ideas for both theatre and film presentations.

Of course you will recognize that the first two series are really just a variation on the Grant Hall series and we would expect to capitalize on the fine work that Dr Castel has done with that program over the past 15 years (or more!).

By time the New Year rolls around I should have a lot of confirmed programming and I will ask one of our technical geniuses to help me to create a CD that I can send to you that will have excerpts from the artists who will be part of our inaugural season.


