REPORT ON GIFTS AND BEQUESTS

- a) For Fellowships, Scholarships and Student Aid

The Alfred Bader Prize in Jewish Studies

Dr. Alfred Bader has donated \$2000 to endow a prize in Jewish Studies at Queen's Theological College.

The Senate at its meeting held on October 21, 1982, approved the following terms of award, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Trustees:

The Alfred Bader Prize in Jewish Studies

Awarded to the student who obtains the highest standing in Religion 235. Value: \$200.

The Deloitte, Haskins & Sells Award

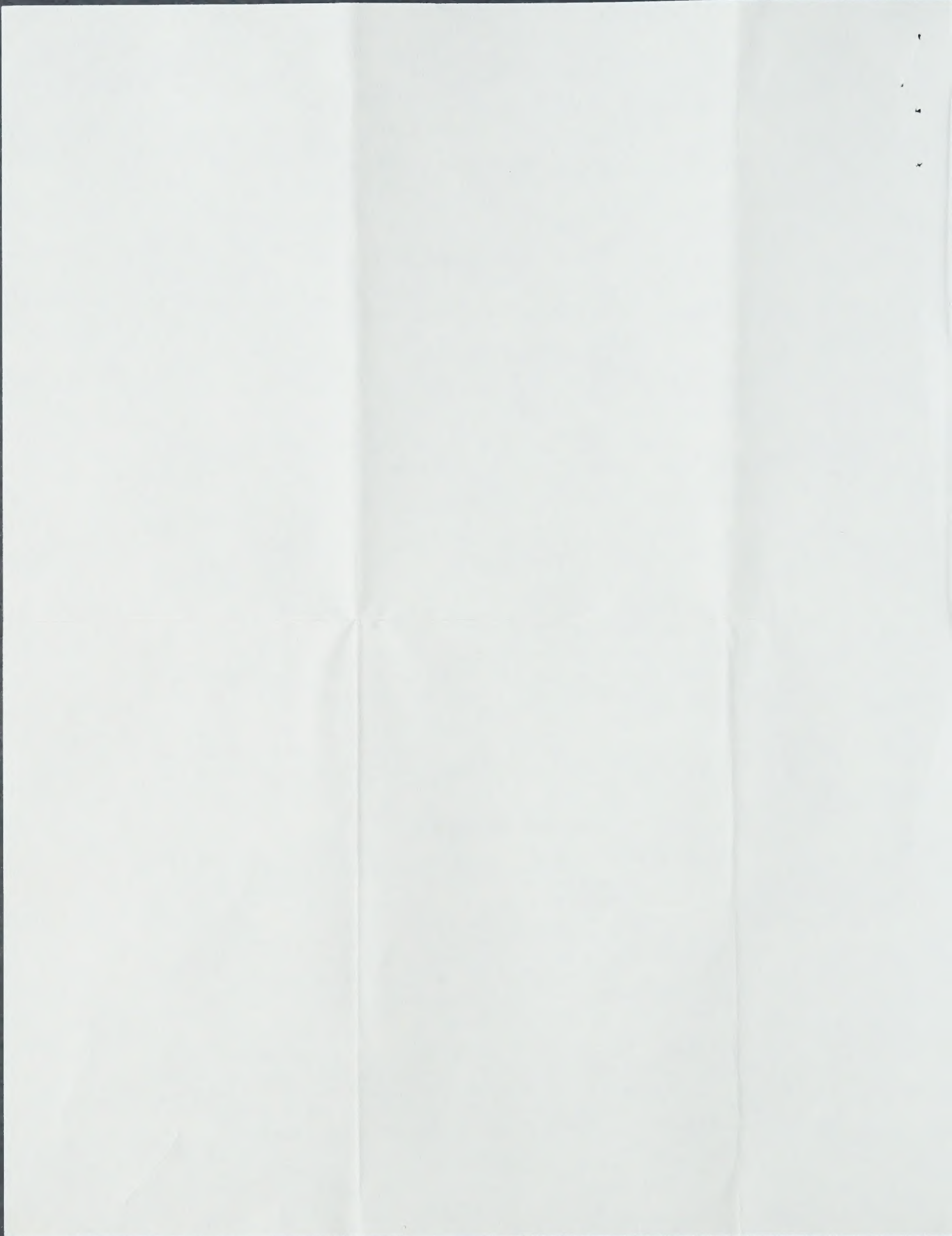
The chartered accountancy firm of Deloitte, Haskins & Sells has undertaken to support an award of \$600 to a student in the third year of the Commerce program, for a 3-year period commencing with the academic year 1982/83.

The Senate at its meeting held on October 21, 1982, approved the following description and terms of award, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Trustees:

The Deloitte, Haskins & Sells Award

Established by Deloitte, Haskins & Sells, Chartered Accountants. Awarded after the Fall term of the third year of the Commerce Program to a student who is concentrating in the accounting area and has gained distinction in his academic work. The recipient should have demonstrated active leadership in university or community life. A Summer position with the firm may be offered to the recipient. Acceptance of this position is not a condition of award.

Application in writing should be made to the Chairman of the Undergraduate Program in the School of Business by January 31. Not more than five students will be nominated by the School of Business for interviews by representatives from Deloitte, Haskins & Sells who will choose the successful candidate.
Value: \$600.



The Edith Whyte Memorial Book Prize in Intermediate Macro Theory

Founded by family, friends and colleagues in memory of Edith M. Whyte, B.A. '48, who at the time of her death in 1980 was the highest-ranking woman at the Bank of Canada. Awarded on the recommendation of the Department of Economics to students displaying outstanding performance in Economics 220 or 221. Number and value: Variable.

The above awards require only a portion of the income generated by the Edith Whyte Memorial Fund. A recommendation concerning the use of the balance of the income will be presented at a later date.

Martin Wolff Memorial Prize

In May 1982, the University received \$1600 from Dr. Alfred Bader to be added to the capital of the Martin Wolff Memorial Prize. With this additional gift, the capital stands at \$3,170.

This award was established in 1948 by Dr. Alfred Bader in memory of the late Mr. Martin Wolff for award to a student in Civil Engineering.

ii) Revised Terms of Award

The Aldrich Chemical Company Scholarship

In May 1982, the University received \$2,600 from Dr. Alfred Bader to increase the capital of the Aldrich Chemical Company Scholarship. The capital now stands at \$5,180.

The Senate at its meeting held on October 21, 1982, recommended the following revised terms, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Trustees:

The Aldrich Chemical Company Scholarship

Established by A.R. Bader, M.Sc.(Queen's), Ph.D.(Harvard). Awarded in October to a student in the Faculty of Arts and Science or in the Faculty of Applied Science who has registered in the fourth year and obtained the highest average in Chemistry 381* and one in Chemistry 382* or Chemistry 383*. Value \$475.
